

Play a game together.

TIPS FOR USING THIS CURRICULUM

Three Recommendations As You Lead Your Friends In Playing, Praying, Growing & Going

1) FAMILIARIZE

Prior to your weekly YCI club gatherings, spend time reading the curriculum to make sure you understand the game and devotional. Leading is easier when you are well-prepared!

2) ORGANIZE

The "Grow" portion of the YCI Club Curriculum gives you the "pieces" for a devotional, but it is up to you to put the pieces together. You may want to give "Book, Hook, Look & Took" a try:

- 1) Book: Read the Bible verses.
- **2) Hook:** Share a brief personal story or idea that relates to the Scripture.
 - 3) Look: Share the context of the Scripture.
 - **4) Took:** Share the takeaways from the "Learn & Apply" section.

3) CUSTOMIZE

Since every YCI club is different, it is important that you modify this content to fit your context. If you need help with this, we encourage you to reach out to your club's Campus Mentor!




TELEPHONE CHARADES!

First, one person should be chosen as the "Telephone Operator," and the rest of the YCI club should form a single line, with each student facing the back of another student's head. Once the line is formed, the Telephone Operator should whisper a phrase into the ear of the person at the back of the line. Next, the person at the back of the line should tap the shoulder of the next person in line and proceed to "act out" the phrase that the Telephone Operator whispered in their ear. One by one, each student will do their best to act out what they think the phrase is to the next person in line. Once everyone has acted out the phrase, the last person in line should guess what the original phrase was. Unlike most games, this one really doesn't have a winner. The purpose is to create a fun environment that gets everyone laughing!





Club Time

GROW: Context

WHERE WE'RE GOING

While many of us have a general understanding of the Christmas story, it can be easy to overlook the magnitude of what took place in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago. The Son of God, who has been ruling and reigning since before the beginning of time, demonstrates radical humility through placing Himself at the level of man, fulfilling Isaiah 7:14: "...Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel [translated *God with us*]".

In the "God With Us" curriculum, we will walk through Luke 2:1-38 and take a closer look at three key components of the Christmas story:

1) The Arrival: Luke 2:1-7

2) The Announcement: Luke 2:8-21

3) The Assignment: Luke 2:22-38

Prayerfully, through this study, we will develop a deeper understanding that Immanuel not only came to us, but He is *still with us* as we navigate this broken world!

GROW: Read

LUKE 2:1–7 (ESV)

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 And all went to be registered, each to his own town. 4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. 6 And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn."

GOD WITH US: THE ARRIVAL

A Return Home

As the result of a Roman decree, Joseph and Mary are required to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem (the city of David) at the peak of Mary's pregnancy. As this young couple returns to the homeland of Joseph's ancestors, the Son of God is preparing to leave His home in heaven to redeem our broken world!

A Lack Of Room

Curiously, God's sovereignty does not allow for a comfortable space where Mary can deliver her child. For the remainder of His life on earth, Jesus continually finds Himself in environments of rejection and indifference.

An Unremarkable Birth

In a city far from home, with nothing but a manger (feeding trough) to lay her child in, Mary delivers the Savior of the world. From His birth in Bethlehem to His crucifixion at Golgotha, the King of Kings chooses to live the life of a lowly servant.


QUESTION #3





Big Idea
